## ISRAEL AND THE TOWN OF NORTH HEMPSTEAD

As Supervisor, I will support educational programming and cultural festivals to edify and enrich our entire population. With antisemitism on the rise, it is more important than ever to elect a Supervisor with a deep and lasting connection to Israel. I consider it a personal obligation to provide educational opportunities about Jewish heritage through the Town government. Even in New York, some schools do not devote nearly enough time to discussing the political and moral failures that enabled the Holocaust. The statistics are alarming; 63 percent of Gen Z Americans do not know that six million Jews died in the Holocaust. Even more disquieting: 20 percent of the same demographic believe that Jews were responsible for the genocide. We must not sit idly by as extremists try to erase our history. As Town Supervisor, I will proudly present the Israeli flag at Town Hall on Israeli Independence Day. Further, I will ensure our North Hempstead Television (NHTV) channel features interviews with local Holocaust survivors, their children, or biographers throughout January, the month of International Holocaust Memorial Day.

# An Open Letter of Resolution to the United States Government in Defense of Israel's Borders

**WHEREAS**, the Town of North Hempstead has within its jurisdiction over 225,000 residents, many of whom are personally and/or spiritually connected to the State of Israel...

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that we who have attached our names to this Resolution and who collectively represent thousands of Americans, do hereby re-affirm that Israel's borders may not be negotiated away by other nations or peoples, including our own; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the United States of America recognizes Israel's right to exist as a sovereign state among the nations of the world, and as a Jewish state, situated forever in the land of Israel and, therefore, its borders must reflect that reality now and forever;

**THEREFORE**, we who are signatories to this Resolution believe that peace in the Middle East... can only be achieved when all involved understand that the existence of Israel as a Jewish state, the survival of Israel as a nation, and the security of the Israeli people, are not negotiable.

### REPUDIATING BDS

The Israeli-Palestinian conflict is complex and requires careful consideration and deliberation between the parties before it can ever be resolved. But there are those who choose to unfairly blame Israel for this conflict, despite continued terrorist attacks and stubborn refusal to cooperate from Palestinian leadership. The Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) Movement in particular has been waging a sustained campaign to vilify, isolate, pressure, and delegitimize Israel by convincing nations and businesses to sanction and boycott all Israeli products and institutions. They cloak themselves in the language of international law, but in fact they selectively choose what laws and provisions they purport to represent in a bid to undermine Israel at all costs. In 2017, Town Supervisor Judi Bosworth passed legislation to prevent the Town of North Hempstead from working with any contractors that support BDS. If elected, I would seek to expand this legislation to include sub-contractors, as well, so that residents can rest easy knowing that none of their taxpayer money is going to intolerant groups.
